- Increase in the percentage of students receiving a C or higher for English.
- Close the Gap in reading results of Indigenous students across all Year levels.
- Ensure that 100% of students increase their reading results each term using PM/Probe Benchmarking.

Student Wellbeing

- Ensure that 100% of identified Tier 2 students receive support, from our Student Engagement Team, aligned to their individual needs.
- Ensure that 100% of identified Tier 3 students, and their families, are provided with support from our school based Social Worker and Student Engagement Team.
- Ensure that all students whose attendance is <85% receive a Case Manager to support their increased attendance.

Our initiatives include

Curriculum, Teaching and Learning

- Providing teaching teams with four Collaborative Planning Days per year to plan and implement whole school Teaching of Writing Framework into every classroom.
 - Focus areas:
 - Analysis of pre-assessment to identify next steps learning for all students;
 - Making learning visible through quality feedback to and for students; and
 - Differentiating learning for our diverse range of learners (Tier 1, Tier 2 and Tier 3).
- Providing targeted professional development and coaching to deepen teachers' understanding of the Australian Curriculum and whole school Teaching of Writing Framework. Provision of professional learning, coaching and feedback.
- Providing each classroom with a teacher aide to support teaching and learning during daily 'Literacy Blocks'. Teachers and Teacher Aides collaborate to establish differentiation practices in every classroom.

Student Wellbeing

- Strengthening and broadening Positive Behaviour for Learning Tier 2 processes within the school by incorporating Trauma Informed Practices into school routines and processes.
- Providing support focusing on student engagement in the classroom for identified Tier 2 and Tier 3 students through the employment of two Student Engagement Teachers.





- Supporting identified Tier 3 students and family wellbeing through the employment of a Social Worker; and focused target programs, processes and referrals to outside support agencies.
- Employing a Community Liaison Officer (Indigenous) to support the case management of indigenous students attending <85%.
